## GALILEO: Chef-de-Race (Classic/Solid)

## A chip off the old block

GALILEO, a son of Sadler's Wells, out of the Arc-winning Miswaki mare Urban Sea, stands at Coolmore Stud in Ireland. As a racehorse he was trained in Ireland by Aidan O'Brien at Ballydoyle, becoming champion three-year-old in Europe by winning six of his eight appearances in the 2000 and 2001 seasons, including the Derby, Irish Derby and King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes. He was beaten a head when runner-up to Fantastic Light in a thrilling Irish Champion Stakes. A tame performance at Belmont Park in the Breeders' Cup Classic brought the curtain down on his racing career, when only sixth behind Tiznow and Sakhee, running more than a stone below his form. His retirement was announced immediately after the race.

In the 2001 International Classifications Galileo was assessed at 129. He was given a best Racing Post rating (RPR) of 132 for his victory over Fantastic Light in the King George, with Timeform giving him a final rating of 134.

At stud he's been a prolific stallion and has succeeded as champion sire seven times, in 2008, 2010 and each subsequent year to 2015. He was used as a shuttle stallion between Ireland and Australia at first, but since 2012 has stood exclusively in Ireland. He has some 60 Group/Grade 1 winners, including: World Champion **Frankel** (Classic winner of the 2,000 Guineas and Group 1 winner of the Dewhurst, St. James's Palace Stakes, Sussex Stakes (2011 & 2012), Queen Elizabeth II Stakes, Lockinge, Queen Anne Stakes, Juddmonte International and Champion Stakes); **Cape**

Of this sample a clear concentration of progeny winners (163, or 66.5%) is seen between 10 and 12 furlongs inclusive. There is a virtually equal split either side of this of 17.1% of progeny winners at 7 to 9 furlongs and 16.4% at 12 to 14+ furlongs inclusive. This is a very strong indicator of middle-distance prepotency in the band of 10 to 12 furlongs, balanced on one side by Classic speed and on the other by stamina. Rather than lump this into a plain Solid designation a Classic/Solid split would seem to better reflect the range of distance aptitude in Galileo's progeny, reinforcing the same characteristics of his own sire Sadler's Wells (also a Classic/Solid *chef-de-race*).

There is a consequent reshuffling in the individual order and a general shift to enhanced stamina for the group as a whole. Order Of St George appears as somewhat of an anomaly. We might expect to see a Gold Cup winner much higher in the table. Yet despite showing no less than 12 points in the stamina wing of his profile, he is also showing excellent prepotent speed influences, suggesting that he might be just as good at middle distances as he was in the Gold Cup. Indeed, finishing placed in this season's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, as we go to press (in which Galileo was responsible for the first three home), supports this view.

As a sire of sires Galileo's sons have also begun to make an impact at stud, with the likes of Teofilo, New Approach and Rip Van Winkle all responsible for Group 1 winners.

And like his sire Sadler's Wells, Galileo is also a sire of broodmares whose offspring have achieved Group 1 success.

Such have been Galileo's exploits at stud that some have questioned why he had not already been added to the *chef-de-race* list. Galileo is of course one of those sires we monitor closely with regard to performance trends for his progeny. He has been showing good prepotent concentration at middle-distances and is more than capable of getting enhanced stamina types. There is clear evidence that he is at least reinforcing the influence of his own sire. While also building a compelling case on his own account, there has been no pressing requirement to include him on the CDR list as, for the most part, the figures were already reflecting a good approximation of reality. Ruler Of The World (DI 1.05 and CD 0.26) and Australia (DI 1.00, CD 0.13) were already virtual blueprints for the Derby without the need for factoring in Galileo. The fact that Galileo was the stallion closest up in these pedigrees could have only added to our confidence of their suitability for staying the Derby trip. Indeed, my own column in the *Racing Post Weekender*, previewing the Derby, put these two up in 2013: *World can rule at Derby trip*, and 2014: *Australia has ideal stamina suitability*.

While Galileo's inclusion reinforces that of his own sire, if anything it actually makes the readings a little top heavy until subsequent generations begin to work through. Nevertheless, the profiles in the second table look both more robust, certainly with regard to stamina, and overall more accurate than in the unadjusted table. While Galileo's inclusion is not really telling us anything new that is not a

reason for not including him, given that he is showing clear evidence of prepotent aptitude. Indeed, it was never a question of *if* Galileo would join the ranks of the CDRs but *when*. The task now is to give him a precise placing. We assign Galileo as a **Classic/Solid** *chef-de-race*, the 226<sup>th</sup> of the series.

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
